BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF KIRKLAND:

in the town of Kirkland, said system being owned by said town, and being in danger of becoming poluted, and an inadequate supply being available for summer use, it is resolved by said Council to request, and they do hereby request the election board of King County Washington to call a special election in the town of Kirkland to vote on the question of becoming indebted and issueing general bonds in the sum of \$15000.00 to raise revenue to make the necessary improvements.

Section 2: That said proposition was voted on at the general elpection held in said town on March 10, 1925, but on account of sickness in said town and lack of understanding of the law there was an insufficient number who voted on the said bond issue; the total number voting being 291, out of which 205 voted in favor of the issue and 42 voted against the issue, making a total of 247 voting on the bond issue which is not 50% of the total number of votes cast at the last general election.

Section 3: That the attorney for the said town be and he is here-by authorized to employ such help as may be necessary for the calling of a special election for the purpose of voting on said bond issue and doing all necessary work preparatory to the issuance of said bonds for the improvement of said water system.
